Dear Torah School Parents,

I hope this note finds you well. It is hard to believe we are almost done with another year. This year we piloted our new looping curriculum. As with all new things there were a few glitches but overall it was a great success. Students of different ages were able to study together as both leaders and followers. Many positive Jewish identities of our students expanded their social network through the new classroom configuration. Our emphasis on measurable skills and positive Jewish identity is continuing to ensure that by the end of the 7th grade each student can comfortably navigate a Jewish prayer service with proficient understanding and joy.

Each class will be a two grade mix. Each group will have goals and objectives. Upon the completion of each two year learning pod, *Gan*, *Yisod*, *Tzofim*, *Etgar* and *Etzim*, students will achieve measurable skills that will add to creating a positive Jewish identity and an ability read Hebrew, navigate a *siddur* (prayer book), and discover a personal relationship with Jewish culture and tradition.

Gan - Pre-Kindergarten/ Kindergarten

Ellen Winnick

- During these years students will be exposed to basic Jewish concepts, holidays, and Hebrew letters. Through a play and learn interactive format students will engage in hands on activities. Students must be at least 4 years old to participate in our Sunday Gan program.

Yisod (Foundation) 1st -2nd: Students will meet Sunday and Wednesday

- Yisod א (First Grade) will continue to come once a week on Sunday
Students will learn to read and write letters and vowels

- Yisod ב (Second Grade) will come twice a week Sunday and Wednesday
Students will learn to decode basic words and vowels. This will be a small group which will allow the teacher to provide each student with the focused attention needed to ensure a strong Hebrew foundation providing the opportunity for effective Hebrew language development as the student develops.
Students will also do in-depth exploration into Shabbat and Havdalah.

Tzofim (Explorers) 3rd-4th: Students will meet Sunday and Wednesday

Jason Pollack

- During these years students will continue to become fluent in Hebrew. In addition to learning how to lead and the meaning of the Kabbalat Shabbat and Maariv services.

Etgar (Challenge) 5th-6th Students will meet Sunday and Wednesday

Jason Schwartz

- During these years the students will learn the structure, how to chant and how to lead the Shacharit (morning) and Torah services. These are the two services that the students will be required to lead as they become B'nai Mitzvah. During these years students will also learn Torah and Haftarah Trope.

Eitzim (Pillars) 7th Students will meet Sunday and Wednesday

- A standalone year dedicated to the continued development of the students' Jewish identity. This program is broken into two separate classes. Sundays are a three-part curriculum focused on our Jewish past, present and future. Sunday's curriculum begins with a unit on Family History. Each student has the opportunity to explore his/her Jewish family history and tell that story to the community. In addition to the student and family exploring their family history, students have the opportunity to develop their public speaking skills. The second unit will be a unit on understanding how we relate to one another from a Jewish perspective. Using the text of *Pirke Avot* (Ethics of our Fathers), students will learn how to make ethical Jewish choices. The third Sunday unit will be about the *Shoa* (Holocaust); students will learn the history of it, and its impact on the Jewish people. The third unit will culminate with a field trip to the Museum of Tolerance in Los Angeles.

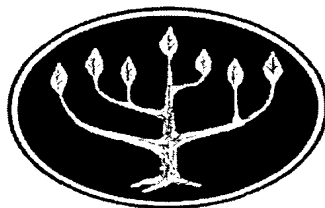
The Wednesday curriculum is a service learning program dedicated to the development of students understanding of *mitzvot*, Conservative Judaism and making Jewish choices.

Who we Are?

A fun and engaging Torah School Committed to educating our young people with love while providing them with the Judaic and Hebrew skills to lead a meaningful Jewish life while creating a vibrant in vibrant Jewish future!

HOW DO I SUBMIT MY REGISTRATION PACKET? All registration forms can be hand-delivered, mailed or emailed to the synagogue office. If you email your packet, we will keep the form on file for future years. The packets will be processed promptly. Once your packet is complete and the fees are submitted, the forms will be stamped with the current date.

WHEN DOES SCHOOL MEET?

Religious School begins on Sunday September 11, 2011. A school calendar has been included. Please keep this handy for future reference.

Sunday: 9:00 a.m. to 12:15 p.m.

Wednesday: 4:00 to 6:15 p.m.

Students in grades Pre-K through 7th will meet on Sundays from 9:00-12:15. Students in 2nd-7th will also meet on Wednesdays from 4-6:15. Hebrew lab will be offered on Wednesdays for students in grades 2-6 T'fillah will be at 9:00 on Sunday mornings. We invite parents to join their children during this special time. **Students are required to attend class regularly in order to support the continuity of learning. Children are expected to attend at least 75% of class both midweek (when applicable) and on Sundays.**

SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS: If students do not attend at least 70% of class time they will be asked to complete make-up work at home. In some cases if students are not in attendance for least 75% of class time parents may also be asked to hire a private tutor, at their own expense, to supplement their child's Hebrew education so that the student's education can remain on target for B'nai Mitzvah.

SERVICE ATTENDANCE:

Gan-Yisod (Pre-K/K/1/2): Attend at least 6 prayer services throughout the year.

Tzofim (3/4) 10 prayer services over the course of the school year.

Etzim (5) 12 prayer services over the course of the school year.

Etzim/Etgar (6/7) in preparation for B'nai students must attend **18 services** over the course of the school year.

- The goals of this REQUIREMENT are to increase students' mastery of the Hebrew liturgy, to provide practice in synagogue ritual, and to expand awareness and enjoyment of communal Shabbat experiences. There will be a special treat at the end of the year for all of the students that complete their requirement.
- There will be a variety of developmentally appropriate prayer opportunities for children throughout the year.

FAMILY PROGRAMS: The classrooms of Congregation B'nai Shalom are supplemented by lively family education opportunities. Jewish family education aims to: (1) expose families and their members to relevant Jewish content and experiences; (2) engage parents and children in meaningful family interactions; and (3) provide tools for living a Jewish life outside of the synagogue setting. **Family programs are a required part of our curriculum. Students and parents are required to arrive on time and stay for the entire family program.** We invite families from outside of our synagogue community to join us for these fun and interactive programs.

ENRICHMENT LAB: We offer an Enrichment Lab ON WEDNESDAYS for students who need extra help in Hebrew and for students who are particularly advanced and able to move forward at an accelerated rate speed. The Enrichment Lab is available to any student who needs Hebrew-language enrichment outside the classroom. A trained adult specialist staffs the lab and may be assisted by a teacher's aide, who can supervise reading exercises. It aims to provide supplementary exercises, one-on-one tutoring, and/or a challenging, developmentally appropriate place to work. No child will be in the lab, away from his/her classmates, for the whole class session. If you feel that your child would benefit assignment to the Enrichment Lab, please contact the Director of Congregational Learning.

LEARNING ACCOMODATIONS: Many children require special learning accommodations due to a wide range of physical, motor, cognitive, behavioral, or emotional challenges. If you feel that this pertains to your child, be sure to fill out the Special Needs form and submit it with your packet. This information will be reviewed so that your child may receive the best possible Jewish education. We will work with you to develop a Jewish Educational Action Plan that includes an appropriate blend of classroom adaptations and assistance outside the classroom. **Congregation B'nai Shalom is committed to inclusive education—providing for the educational needs of a diverse community of learners.**

ALLERGIES AND POTENTIALLY LIFE-THREATENING MEDICAL ISSUES: Please inform us of any allergies or other potentially life-threatening medical issues pertaining to your child. We have a form (*Medical Alert Form*) for sharing this information. For those students who require medication to be dispensed by the Religious School office in emergencies (e.g. inhalers or epi-pens), please note this on the Medical Alert Form. (Such medicines may be stored in the child's classroom or in their own school bag.)

Education Taskforce

- Sukkot

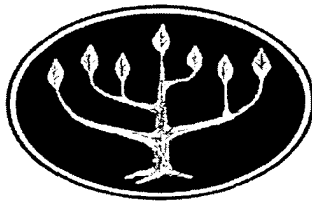
Special Tasks

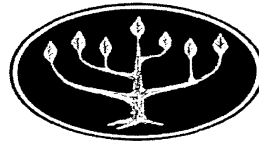
